Summer Arts Return to Woodhill

In the wake of two summers of Covid-19 shutdowns, Urban Impact reignited an exciting partnership with amazing teachers from Breckenridge and Lansdowne Elementary schools to host Summer Arts Camp at Woodhill Community Center. Since its inception in 2011, the purpose of Arts Camp has been to create opportunities and avenues for young people to express themselves and build relationships among peers, volunteers, and our Urban Impact Staff. (In fact, some campers from the early years loved these relationships so much that they are now summer camp interns with us!)

Woodhill Community Center is always buzzing, but it really came alive when nearly 70 students from each school

came to develop their creative talents at Arts Camp. They painted, papier-mâchéd, danced, jammed on djembes, sang, created street art, and even wrote and performed theater skits. On the last day of Arts Camp, parents, friends and families were invited to celebrate the student's work during an Art Showcase, which included live dance, music, and skit performances to go along with displays of all the incredible artwork students had created throughout the week. During the Showcase, students put their hearts into entertaining the community — even if that meant

performing to the beat of their own drum!

After Summer Arts Camp came to a close, Urban Impact wasted no time before bringing in kids for our Academy Camp. At Academy Camp, our Woodhill community kids experienced the love of Jesus as they learned life skills, developed their leadership skills, and enjoyed a summer full of fun, faith, and friendship.
